



Thrive EnviroArt Competition 2019

The brief: Promote awareness of issues around BIODIVERSITY

Create a **3 dimensional educational wall piece** and send in a photo and/or short video of the artwork to enviroquizart@thrive.org.za by 23rd August for judging. **One entry per school only.**

Thrive will give an audio-visual display of all the entries at the annual Thrive EnviroQuiz/Art event on the 6th September 2019 at Kronendal school. If possible please bring your wall piece to the event on 6th September for all to enjoy.

Some examples of topics to explore:

- A healthy ecosystem and the diversity that makes it so
- Biodiversity in the ocean
- Biodiversity in the forest
- Biodiversity in the desert.
- All life on earth is an example of biodiversity.
- The impact of non-recyclable waste on the biodiversity of a particular ecosystem
- Other biodiversity themes you might think of

The judges would like to see that the children have thought deeply on these issues and to see the creative ways that learners propose to share their findings with the school community.

The wall piece can be intended for indoors or outdoors

The art piece should be self-explanatory i.e. it should not need long written explanations, although it may make use of words.

As part of your work and along with recycled materials, use *foil-based waste materials* that cannot be recycled, including any *foil lined packaging*, eg chip packets.

Also research current items of packaging that cannot be recycled and include these in the artwork.

The art piece may make use of natural and organic materials from the environment as well as paint and glue, although these materials should not dominate the piece.

Minimum size 1m X 1.5m

Judges will be looking at:

1. The visual impact of the piece.
2. The strength of the message.
3. The creative use of simple non-recyclable and recyclable materials.
4. Evidence of collaboration between the group, making the piece without adult involvement. The piece must be clearly learner driven, with guidance.

Prizes: Prizes will be awarded in the Primary and High school categories.
